

Worldwide and European challenges




The interim evaluation of Horizon 2020 identified a need to further improve the monitoring and evaluation framework to track and assess the impact of the Framework Programme in the short, medium and longer terms according to its wider set of objectives (*Lessons learnt from H2020 mid-term evaluation*).



Horizon Europe 2021-2027 as an impact-oriented framework programme

Definition of Impact

Wider long term effects on **society** (including the environment), the **economy** and **science**, enabled by the outcomes of R&I investments (long term). It refers to the specific contribution of the project to the work programme expected impacts described in the destination. Impacts generally occur some time after the end of the project.




From EU priorities to Work Programme Destinations



- The **strategic plan** sets out strategic orientations and impacts areas for four years (first HE strategic plan 2021-2024), formulated on expected impacts.
- Each **expected impact** is targeted via dedicated packages of actions in the work programme, termed **destinations**.
- The **work programmes** (WPs) cover 2-year periods and include call for proposals, containing one or more topics.
- Applicants apply for a **specific call and topic**.

Each **topic** to which applicants can apply will include:



- Topic **scope**
- Topic expected **outcome**
- Expected **impact** of the destination to which the topic belongs
- Type of **action**
- Topic **budget** (or budget shared by group of topics)








